The Department of Educational Psychology and Special Services invites applications for an Assistant/Associate tenure track, nine month position in School Counseling beginning Fall 2017. Applicants will be expected to take a leadership role and teach in the School Counseling Program. Additional teaching assignments will be based on candidate's experience and expertise. The successful candidate will assume a range of responsibilities including the following: (1) teaching graduate level courses, including online instruction, hybrid, and online courses; (2) developing a sustained program of research and scholarship; (3) participating in broad-based university, college, and departmental committee work, and professional service; (4) advising students, and (5) supervising students' field experiences. Teaching in summer school is generally available.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS: Applicants must have the following: (1) an earned doctorate in Counselor Education [ABD considered but doctorate must be completed before employment]; (2) experience as School Counselor K-12; (3) evidence of teaching effectiveness in graduate level courses (for advanced Assistant/Associate); (4) evidence of a sustainable program of scholarship, research, and grant writing (for advanced Assistant/Associate); (5) ability to work collaboratively with other faculty and professionals (6) commitment to contribute to the effort to achieve CACREP accreditation.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS: Active participation in appropriate professional organizations; certification eligible as a school counselor in Texas; familiarity with the ASCA model, English/Spanish bilingual.
