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<b>Position:</b>	Faculty Position in Counselor Education (Ocala, Florida)
<b>Starting Date:</b>	Academic Year 2016 -2017/ 2017-2018 <b>A Spring 2017 start date is preferred.</b>
<b>Qualifications:</b>	The Department of Professional Counseling at Webster University invites applications for a full-time instructor appointment in Counselor Education with both teaching and administrative responsibilities at the Webster University campus in Ocala, Florida. A doctorate in Counselor Education, preferably from a CACREP-accredited program, is required. Applicants should identify with the counseling profession through memberships in professional organizations (i.e., ACA and/or its divisions). Experience in teaching, clinical supervision of counselors in training, and eligibility as a Licensed Mental Health Counselor in Florida is also required.
<b>Duties:</b>	<p>This is a twelve (12) month non-status academic position. Faculty members have advising and clinical supervision responsibilities, are expected to teach core counseling courses, and engage in professional development and other activities to support a counselor identity. In addition, instructors are expected to participate in appropriate department and university activities. The position also includes some administrative duties.</p> <p>Administrative duties of this position involve oversight of the counseling program in Ocala in conjunction with a State Counseling Director and the Department faculty. The ideal candidate will have 1) experience teaching in a counselor education program, 2) experience implementing/adhering to professional standards (e.g., CACREP, CAEP, etc.), 3) some administrative experience, and 4) experience teaching clinical counseling field experience courses.</p>
